Measurement Scale Fact Sheet

Index of Job Satisfaction (IJS)

Information about job satisfaction among employees is often sought for use in many different reports and research undertakings. Despite the need for such information, it is been difficult to obtain with the use of standardized, reliable, and valid measurement tools. It is hoped the IJS scale will help to solve that information deficit for those who seek and use information about their employment.

Score Interpretation

The scale produces scores that range from 0 to 100. For all practical purposes the scores can be regarded as true ratio scale values. Low scores indicate poor job satisfaction as judged by the respondent, while large scores indicate high levels of job satisfaction.

Cutting Scores

It is not likely that this scale will have a meaningful cutting score because it will be difficult to reach consensus on what score will represent minimal job satisfaction. An obvious benchmark that you might consider this the traditional academic grading criteria, where A = 90-100, B = 80-89, C = 70-79, and so forth.

This scale consistently achieves an Alpha coefficient of .90 or larger.

Validity

This scale has been investigated with respect to content, construct, factorial, and known groups validity. It nearly always achieves validity coefficients of .60 or greater.
